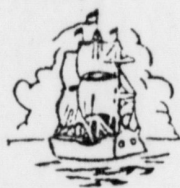

tension agricultural econom-
ics at the Pennsylvania State
University until retirement
with the emeritus rank on
June 30, 1954.

Reist graduated from the
university in 1913, taught
school in Minnesota for two
years, and then served as
Warren County agent from
1915 to 1927. For the next 19
years he had charge of ex-
tension work in agricultural
economics, and in 1946 or-
ganized extension studies.

He was credited with as-
sisting in organizing fire co-
operative egg auctions in the
state and was also a former
president of the Pennsylvania
County Agents Assn.

His wife, the former Jose-
phine Cramer, died seven
years ago.

Surviving are three daugh-
ters and a son, Josephine,
wife of William Smith, Bryn
Mawr; Jean, wife of Ned
Stark, and Parker Reist, both
of New York City, and Miss
Henrietta Reist, at home.

Also surviving are six
grandchildren and these bro-
thers and sisters: Mabel, wife
of C. L. Nissley, and Alvin
Reist, both of Mount Joy;
Mrs. Anna Weaver, Lancast-
er; Mrs. Mary Greider, Lan-
disville, and Eugene Reist, of
Saratoga, Pa.

Funeral services were held
Tuesday from St. Andrews
Episcopal Church and burial
was made in Centre Memori-
al park.

DR. WM. A. ADOLPH
Dr. William A. Adolph,
biochemist and formerly a
Presbyterian missionary and
educator in China, died Sept.
23 after a brief illness. He
was 68 and lived in Hamden,
Conn. Mrs. Adolph is the
daughter of the late Mr. and
Mrs. Henry E. Witmer of Mt.
Joy.

Besides the widow, Kath-
erine, he is survived by four
children, Dr. William A. Ad-
olph Jr., Tuchahoe, N. Y.;
Ernest, of Bedford, Mass.;
Mrs. Helen M. Cope of Rich-
mond, Ind., and Mrs. Dorothy
M. Jewell of New Haven,
Conn.

Born in Philadelphia, he
had a long and distinguished
career. A graduate of the Un-
iversity of Pennsylvania, he
was in Tsinan as a chemist in-
structor in 1915.

followed at Yenching Uni-
versity at Peiping, China;
University of Nebraska; Yale;
University of Illinois; Cor-
nell, and American Univer-
sity in Beirut, Lebanon.

His special interest was nu-
tritional chemistry and nutri-
tional psychology as applied
to the Chinese people and he
published almost 100 scientifi-
c papers on the subject.

Dr. Adolph was in China
when World War II broke
out and was interned in con-
centration camps, returning
home aboard the Gripsholm
in December 1943. In 1947 he
became acting president of
Yenching University, return-
ing home when Communists
took control.

He retired in 1954.
