Light company will make refunds totalling more than \$3.9 million to more than 600,000 of its customers, beginning October 1. Chas. E. Oakes, PPL's chairman of the board, said that the re-

funds will be made to residential and small commercial customers served as of Sept. 29, 1958. The refund will appear as a credit on the regular bill.

Refunds to customers billed monthly will be credited to bills issued during October and will be equivalent to approximately one-third of those bills.

Oakes pointed out that the refunding represents the final step in carrying out an order handed down by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission nearly 2 years ago.

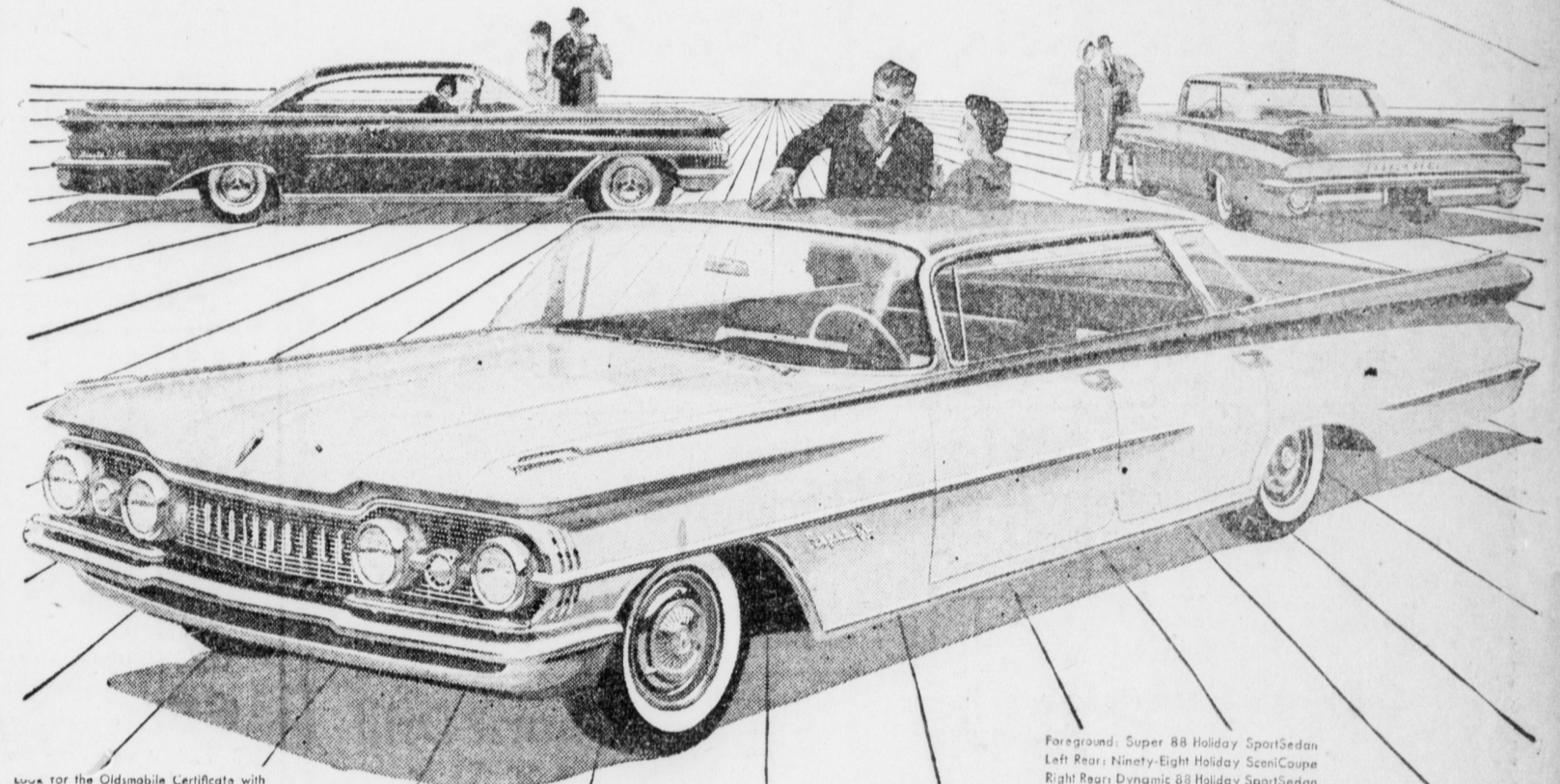

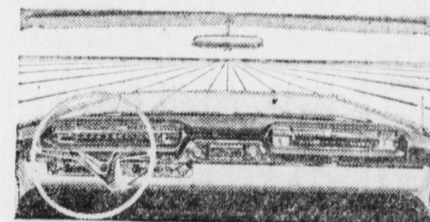
