ple spend as great a percent of their earnings for services (which includes recreation, entertainment and a host of other non-essential items) as do people in the U.S.

Automation, he declared, will not produce unemployment. On the other hand, the man temporarily left without a job will probably be reemployed at a higher skill and better wages helping to build or to service the very kind of machine which first put him out of work.

On the agricultural front he sees no particular change in '60. The farmers are fraught with over production, lower prices, higher prices for their needs and government aid.

The saving factor, he said, is that there are becoming fewer and fewer farmers. Thus, the available number of a smaller number of Americans and the farmers - in aggregate - means. Farmers become fewer, he added.
