CLAYTON KAPP H. Clayton Kapp, eighty-four, 6 Haskell Dr., Lancaster, Pa., died at 8:30 p.m. Monday, Feb. 1, in the General Hospital where he had been a medical patient since Jan. 27.

Kapp, a retired iron mold maker, was well known in the county for his carvings of miniature animals. He carved the figures from a variety of materials, including peach stones and English walnuts.

A native of Elizabethtown, Kapp moved to Mount Joy in 1909. He was employed as an iron molder at Buch Mfg. Co., Elizabethtown, for more than 40 years until his retirement several years ago.

A son of the late John and Fianna Gantz Kapp, he was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church, Mount Joy; and of the Friendship Fire Co., Mt. Joy. His wife, Caroline M. Kapp, died in September, 1955.

Surviving are a daughter, Minnie, wife of Howard B. Snyder, with whom he resided since 1956; two granddaughters, a sister, Miss Daisy Kapp, Lancaster; a brother, Amos, Steelton; and a number of nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held from the Heilig Funeral home Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock and burial will be made in the Mount Joy cemetery.

Ohio Holstein Breaks Record For Butterfat

Brattleboro, Vermont — A registered Holstein cow owned by the Gelbke Brothers, Vienna, Ohio has added new sparkle to her breed's Diamond Jubilee year with a new all-time, all-breed butterfat record.

The Holstein - Friesian Association of America has announced that the 365 day production of Princess Breeze-wood RA Patsy 381 6059 (GP) officially totalled 36,821 lbs. of milk containing an unprecedented 1,866 lbs. of butterfat.

"Patsy" started her lactation at five years, 2 months and is believed to be the youngest cow of any breed ever to capture the national butterfat championship. She is also the first to turn the trick on twice-daily milking.

The previous national record of 1,733 lbs. of butterfat was established last year on three-time milking by an 11 year old Brown Swiss cow in New Jersey.

As an added claim to fame, the Gelbke Holstein started her record-shattering 365 day lactation without benefit of a dry period.

In fact, she missed setting a new Ohio state record for Junior four year olds on Herd Improvement Registry test by freshening on what would have been the 365th day of her previous testing period.

She is officially classified "Good Plus" and is the middle link in a three generation cow family in the Gelbke herd.

Her dam, also classified "Good Plus" and still going strong, averaged 16,682 lbs. of milk and 537 lbs. of butterfat in her two most recent 305 day lactations.

Rounding out the group is a three year old daughter of "Patsy" currently milking more than 80 lbs. of milk a day.
