ABUNDANT LIFE

YOU HAVE EVERYTHING TO LIVE FOR

This is the greatest age in which to be alive since the dawn of creation. Almost overnight our world has taken on a whole new dimension. Outer space has been invaded... landing on the moon is a scientific prediction based on fact... new frontiers are being opened every day in the fields of science, medicine and industry. We are tapping God's resources in an unlimited supply. We are discovering a new world—a world in which the goodness of God is more than abundant. His goodness can become a Presence in your own personal life. And that in itself produces a miracle. It changes you, thrills you, inspires you, makes you acutely aware that there is a God. And when that Presence is gone, you begin to stop living, for man lives for his fellowship with God. He was created for this purpose. I was born into a home where Jesus was regarded as the family's best friend. He was not someone outside the family, nor someone who was far off in Heaven. We were taught that he was right there in the home. So the name of Jesus came to mean something special to us children. But although Christ was in the home, I had never accepted Him as my personal Saviour; even while I was in my teens I left home, still without God. A few months later I was carried back to my parents. I had become afflicted with tuberculosis and was on the verge of death. And so at 17 I reached a point in my life where my health was gone, and I had absolutely nothing to live for. I told my father, "Papa, I'm at the end of my rope." Then I did the only thing a person can do who feels he has nothing to live for—I sought the Presence of Jesus Christ. I found it exactly where I had left it—there in the home around me. I had been like a man dying from thirst while a clear, sparkling stream of water was near him all the time. I found that all I had to do was just say, "Jesus, here I am. Come into my heart." Suddenly I had something to live for. I didn't want to die. Life took on new meaning and shortly afterward I found health and healing from tuberculosis. I really feel that no one has the right to write over his body or his soul: "No hope, I have nothing to live for!" Instead, he should triumphantly declare, "I have everything to live for through Christ." Jesus can be found in the house of God, in miracles of faith or wherever you need Him. You can find Him wherever you are, this very minute. And when you find Him, you will find you have everything to live for.


