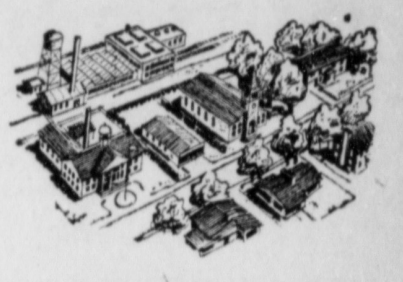
Annual 75 Plus Banquet Plans Made
