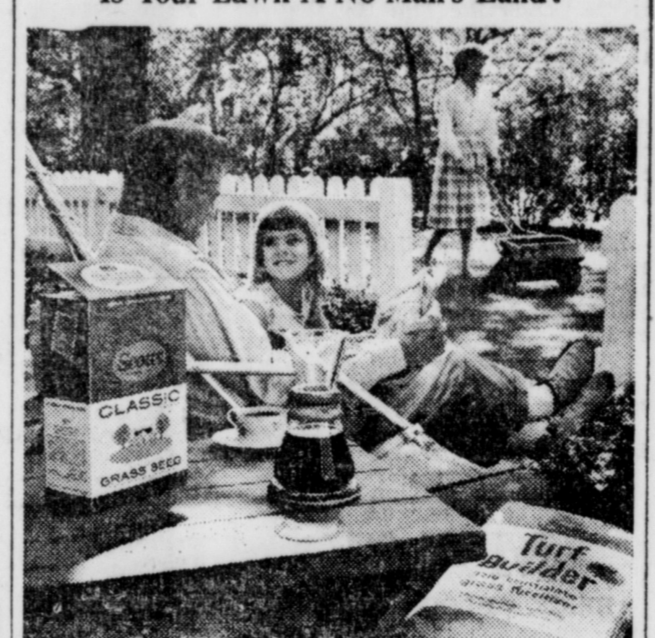
Farm Women Meet
