Rotarians Hear Hold Ladies Nite Register of Wills At Rheems Hall

Harry Gring, Lancaster County Register of Wills, was the speaker Tuesday noon at the weekly luncheon meeting of the Mount Joy Rotary Club, held at Hostetters.

Although a nonpolitical address, he made no attempt to disguise his own political feelings as he spoke of confidence in the American way, of American prestige and of the American formula of thrift, investment of savings, profit and enterprise.

"The man who has made America great," he said, is not the man who saves money. Nor is he the man who has spent his money. The man who has made America great and strong is the man who saved his money, planted it in a fertile field and then with energy, ambition and imagination helped his money grow and multiply."

The speaker was introduced by Curvin Martin.

Farmers Talk Of Ag. Future

Pennsylvania's future in livestock was discussed by the Donegal Advisory Council of the Lancaster County Farmers' Association on Wednesday, October 19th meeting at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Ney on R. D. 1, Marietta. The group discussed the importance of agriculture in Pennsylvania, the red meat gap, the difference between what is produced and consumed in Pennsylvania and the possibilities of increasing livestock production in the Commonwealth.

The agriculture of Pennsylvania it often erroneously considered to be a limited enterprise, diminishing in its significance. Ney, discussion leader, emphasized that nothing could be further from the truth. Over 20 per cent of the Commonwealth's total business can be classified as agricultural.
