

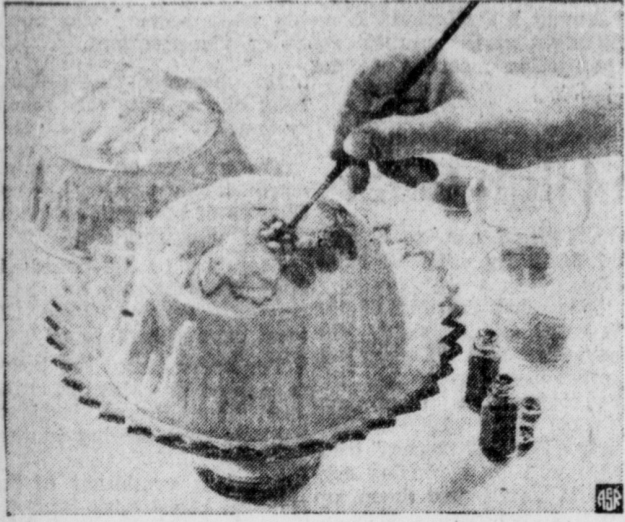

Christmas Colors Dessert



There's both artistry in food and decoration when a handsome eggnog Bavarian cream comes to the holiday table. The raised fruit design, created by the dessert mold container, is painted Christmas red and green with vegetable food coloring.

The beverage blend of milk and eggs that is commercially bottled eggnog provides the ready-made custard base for this traditional holiday dessert. Whipped cream goes in for added richness and smoothness. Then unflavored gelatine gives the dessert its design while at the same time guarding the light, velvety texture so typical of chifon and Bavarian cream desserts.

Molded Eggnog
 2 envelopes unflavored gelatine
 1/4 cup sugar
 1 quart bottled non-alcoholic eggnog
 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg, optional
 4 teaspoons rum flavoring, optional
 1 cup heavy cream, whipped

Combine gelatine and sugar in top of double boiler. Stir in 1 cup of the cold eggnog. Place over boiling water and stir until gelatine and sugar are dissolved. Remove from heat; add remaining eggnog. If additional flavoring is desired, add nutmeg and flavoring. Chill until mixture mounds slightly when dropped from a spoon. Fold in whipped cream. Turn into a 6-cup mold with fruit design; chill until firm. Unmold. Put few drops desired food coloring in small cups; mix with small amount water. Use small paint brush to outline fruit design on mold. Return the gelatine dessert on its serving platter to the refrigerator and keep chilled until dessert time. Yield: 10 servings.

Warn Drivers Of Hazards On Icy Roads

"The driver is more responsible for accidents than are icy or snowy roads", says Edward P. Curran, Keystone Automobile Club's Safety Director.

"That applies to all kinds of driving under all kinds of conditions, of course", he continued. "Obviously, driving on ice and snow can be especially dangerous. But we wish to point out that often it's people rather than conditions that lead to accidents."

"Only a small percentage of fatal accidents occur in snowstorms. Statistics indicate it's safer to drive during periods when ice and snow cover the highway than under ideal conditions. However, we must remember that fewer cars are on the highway during bad weather, and that drivers are more cautious as a rule."

"Skidding is responsible for most accidents on ice and snow. When skidding, the driver should avoid using the brakes suddenly because braking often increases the skid. Removing the foot from the accelerator and steering in the direction of the skid will tend to bring the car back into line. A good driver will try to avoid any situation that might bring a skid."

The Keystone spokesman concluded with some tips for winter driving: use chains or snow tires; always reduce speed on slippery surfaces; pump brake pedal when stopping; don't get too close to the car ahead; make sure the defroster is working and the windshield clean; avoid ruts and rails, and remember to carry a bag of salt or sand in the car to furnish traction where necessary.

Special Speaker For Biology Class

On Friday, Dec. 2, Mrs. Virginia Geltmacher Maurer of East Petersburg spoke to the college preparatory biology classes of Donegal high school on the topic of radioactivity. Mrs. Maurer is a graduate of the Philadelphia General Hospital School of Radiology. The purposes and uses of X-ray were discussed and the processes involved in taking pictures were described along with an explanation of the structure and function of an X-ray machine. Considerable time was spent on the use of radiology in the treatment of cancer. Mrs. Maurer recounted some of her personal experiences in Philadelphia General Hospital.

Several other guest speakers are scheduled for the remainder of the school term in a series designed to acquaint students with practical applications of biology and to stimulate interest in biological study and careers.

USDA Says 'No Such Thing' Dry Rot?

There is no such thing as comparatively safe from "dry rot" declares the U.S. Department of Agriculture's new bulletin "Wood Decay in Houses: How To Prevent and Control It." Wood decay is caused by a fungus which cannot operate in dry wood. The seeds which cause wood rot are present everywhere—in the air, in the corners, even in the kitchen pot on the shelf. These fungi cause wood decay on window sills, around plumbing fixtures, wherever there is a crevice of moisture. In the driest parts of the country, the booklet points out, decay is a minor problem. Modern housing, of the ranch or split-level type, must be constructed with particular care to avoid decay caused by adjacent surfaces with woodwork close to the ground, the bulletin states. The older type house, usually built well above ground, is
