He had been retired for the past three years.

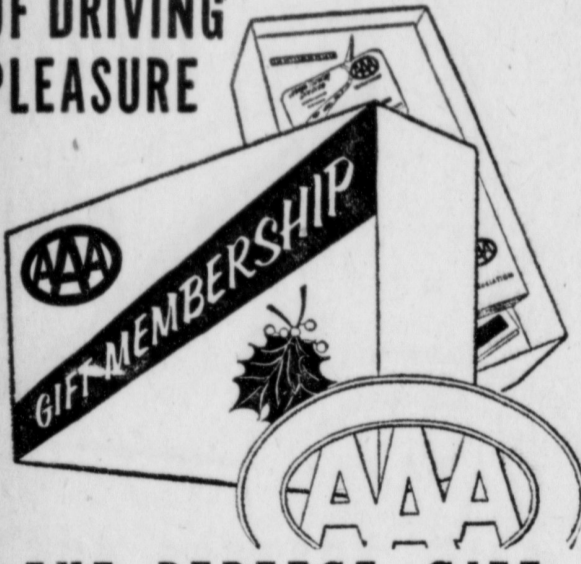

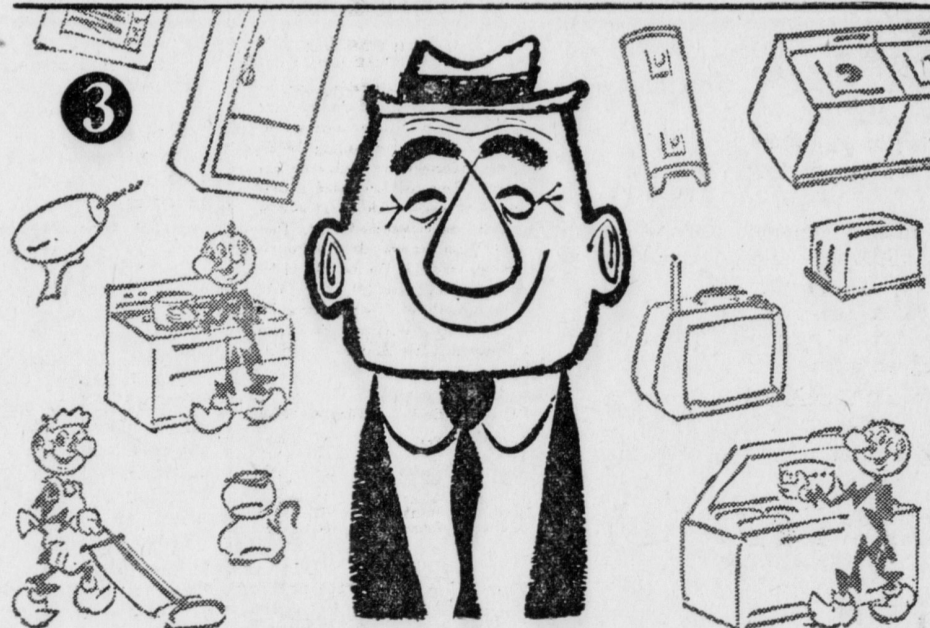
