Those hopes are based on the fact that the Lancaster County Commissioners have authorized a new and second bookmobile stop for many months, library officials said this week. They recognize that there is a need in Mount Joy because there is no available library except Donegal high school. However, with the one bookmobile now in service, such an arrangement has not been possible. Requests for stops by the bookmobile usually are made by individuals or by an organized group, the librarian said, and are accompanied by some kind of a contribution toward the bookmobile. The size of that donation is not set and library officials declined to name any amount. Miss Eleanor Harsh is librarian in charge of the bookmobile.
