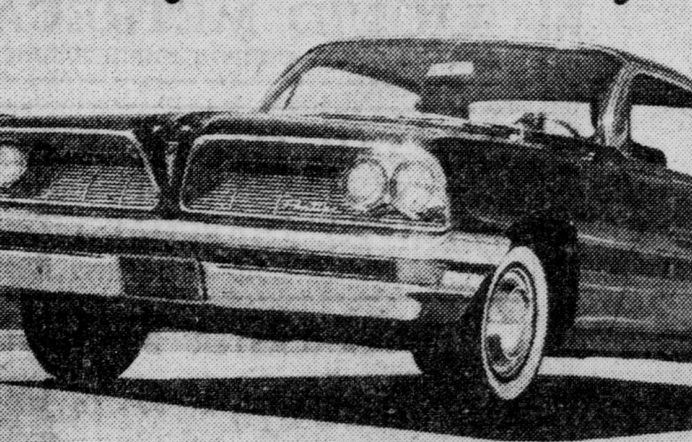

TEST HOLD-OVER SEEDS

Before planting left-over vegetable seed, it's wise to make a germination test says James Dutt, extension vegetable specialist. Plant 25 or 50 seeds in good soil in a plant flat, or put 50 seeds between blotting paper kept moist and warm on a shallow tray or large plate.

Rag Apple Lucifer Louella produced 17,983 lbs. of milk and 635 lbs. butterfat in 312 days on twice daily milking as an 8-year-old. Essex Dauntless Beth made 16,810 lbs. of milk and 664 lbs. butterfat in 295 days on twice daily milking as a 5-year-old. Both are purebred Holstein owned by H. E. & Maybelle Ketterling, Litz.
