County Farm Production Worth Nearly \$90 Million

The previous high of \$88,763,000, 443,200 realized in 1959 was topped by the \$89,817,500 figure for 1960.

Lancaster County continued to be far ahead of all other counties in the state.

Milk was the leading money maker for garden spot farmers. The \$24,157,000 reportedly received put this commodity in the top rank for the third consecutive year. Although the average price per hundredweight was down somewhat from the previous year, increased volume made up the difference. Lancaster County produced 492 million pounds of milk during the year.

Corn continued to be number one crop in the state and Lancaster county led the parade in corn production with 91,000 acres being harvested for grain worth 7-\$265,000.

Tobacco value declined from \$15,412,000 in 1959 to \$13,495,000 last year but Lancaster County still produced over 90 per cent of the state's tobacco.

Value of commodities in the \$89,817,000 are as follows: Milk, \$24,157,000; Eggs, \$23,093,000; Tobacco \$13,495,000; Corn, \$10,293,500; Hay, \$6,112,700; Poultry, \$6,097,500; Wheat, \$3,220,200; and Potatoes, \$1,645,600; Barley, \$289,400; Apples, \$266,000; and Peaches, \$265,000.
