

DON'T SAVE SEEDS

Saving vegetable seeds from the home garden is not usually recommended unless the grower is familiar with conditions and with his plantings. J. O. Dutt, extension vegetable gardening specialist warns that insects carry pollen from one plant to another and the possibility of cross-pollination is al ways present. However, if certain plants are outstanding, have no disease, and produce a large yield of uniform fruit, it might be well to allow fruits to ripen and save the seed of all the fruits. But, remember the individual plant must be considered.
