Mark National FFA Week

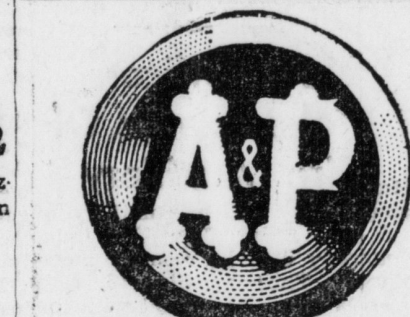
