MAKES GOOD

Franklin (Mack) Shupp, son of Mr. and Mrs. Burton Shupp, Marietta Avenue, has been named the first full-time school psychologist of the Winston-Salem School System in North Carolina.

He has been on the job for six months and already has examined 222 children individually—or 42 for every school month. He has a number of requests on a waiting list. His work is diagnostic. Shupp, the 37 year old Mt. Joy man, works under C. Douglas Carter in the school system's office of special services. He has been flooded with requests from teachers and principals to examine children at all grade levels.

A feature story was printed in the Journal and Sentinel of Winston-Salem in which a picture of Shupp was shown testing one of the children. The story includes his view points on the new job and he cites examples of the problems that the children he meets encounter.

After testing children, Shupp has conferences with the child's parents, his teacher and the principal of his school because he believes the information is vital to all.

A 1949 graduate of Pennsylvania State University, Shupp formerly was employed as a psychologist at the Hershey Industrial School for Boys while he held this position he fulfilled the requirements for a Masters Degree and was granted the degree. Shupp and his family left Pennsylvania in order for him to accept a position in Boylston, North Carolina, as a psychologist there. From the Boylston position he was named the first full-time psychologist in the Winston-Salem School System.

No "Pot Luck" In "Pot Holes"

Don't take "pot luck" with pot holes, warns Keystone Automobile Club.

"Snow, ice and low temperatures have played havoc with the paving on streets and highways throughout the area with resultant danger to unwary motorists", says Edward P. Curran, Keystone Safety Director.

"Exceedingly rough paving, deep holes and actual gullies, and the often sharp edges of broken concrete can prove quite dangerous."

"Drivers who approach such damaged road surfaces at 40 miles per hour or more instinctively might steer to the left or right to avoid banging into the holes or

Such quick action conceivably might send the car into opposing traffic lanes and an accident with oncoming vehicles. This is particularly true on two-lane highways and the danger is even more acute after dark.

"A sudden twist of a car's front wheels can send the vehicle into a deep hole and damage the front end, impair the steering and put the wheels out of alignment. Sharp edges of roadbed also can cut into the sidewalls of tires and weaken them sufficiently to cause dangerous blowouts later.

"Bad as the surfaces are now on many highways, they are almost certain to become much worse when the Spring thaws bring sub-surface expansion. State and local highway repair crews will have their hands busy for some time repairing the effects of one of our worst Winters in years. Accordingly, motorists must be more than usually alert and careful.
