## NEW AFTER-HOUR DEPOSITORY

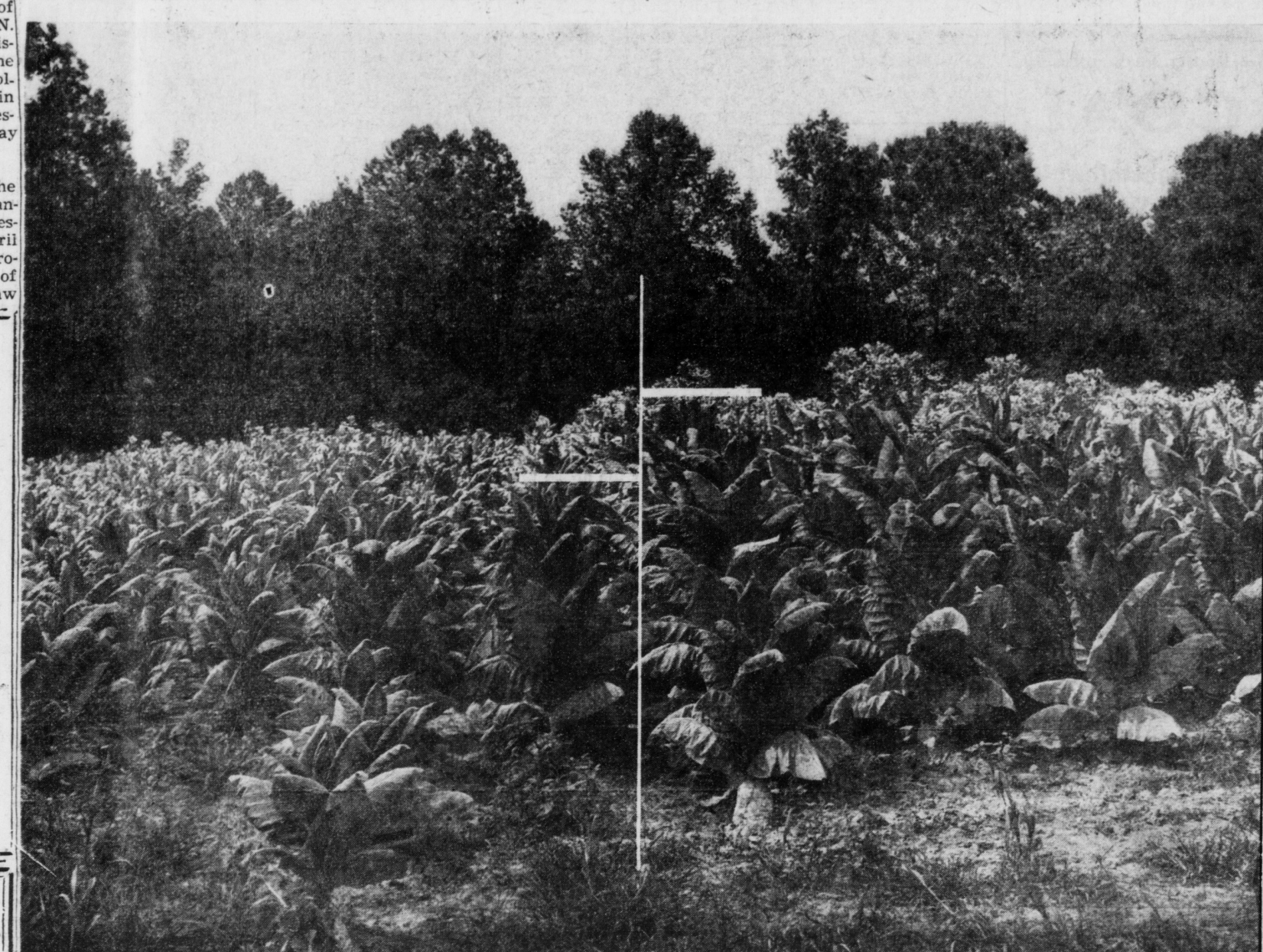
