**AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE ACCUMULATION OR DUMPING OF GARBAGE, ASHES, RUBBISH AND OTHER REFUSE MATTERS UPON PRIVATE PROPERTY OR PUBLIC PROPERTY IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT JOY, LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AND PRESCRIBING THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND THE REMEDIES OF SAID TOWNSHIP.**

BE IT NOW ENACTED that no person, association, firm or corporation shall cause or suffer to remain upon his, hers or its premises or any private or public property, any accumulation of garbage, ashes, rubbish or other refuse matters, or cast the same upon any lot or piece of ground within the said Township of Mount Joy, or upon the shore or margin of any stream or body of water, or upon any public or private road or street in said Township; nor may any person, firm or corporation use or permit to be used any lot or piece of land within the said Township as a public or private dump for the accumulation of garbage, ashes, rubbish or other refuse matters without the prior written approval of the Supervisors of the said Township of Mount Joy.

In any prosecution under this Ordinance, the throwing or dumping of garbage, ashes, rubbish or other refuse matters from a vehicle or tractor by the operator or custodian, or if the accumulation of said garbage, ashes, rubbish or other refuse matters shall in fact constitute a nuisance on public or private grounds in said Township, the Supervisors may after notice to the owner or lessee to do so, and in his default, to collect the cost of the removal of such garbage, ashes, rubbish or other refuse matters, together with such penalties as is hereinafter prescribed, from the owner or lessee by summary proceedings. In addition hereto, the Township Supervisors may also institute proceedings in the courts of equity of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, requesting appropriate relief by way of injunction, abatement of nuisance or other relief.

In addition to any of the above remedies, if any person, firm or corporation shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance, they shall upon summary conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, and costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days, providing that if the conviction is a first offense, every days neglect shall be deemed a new and separate offense.

Should any part of this Ordinance be held invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining parts shall be severable and shall continue to be in full force and effect.

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with or

contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as the same affect this Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after adoption.
