Hold your horses at night.

Two-thirds of the traffic accidents occur at night even though only one half of the miles driven are after sundown. Because of the reduced vision and many deceiving flashing lights, you can't see the dangers as quickly as in the daytime.

And there's only one way to solve this problem. Drive at a lower speed from sunset to sunrise. Don't gamble with your life to save a few minutes. Slow down at Sundown!

Hold your horses whenever you are tired.

Sleepy drivers are involved in a large number of serious crackups. As you become sleepy, you are less alert and your reaction time slows down. If the highway is long and straight, you become even more drowsy. You are not mentally as fast under those conditions as when you are fresh and wide awake - Your driving should not be as fast either. Get off the road and take a nap, if you can.

If you must, keep on driving, open the windows, turn on the radio and SLOW DOWN.

In towns and cities, failure to yield the right of way at intersections is one of the highest single causes of accidents. A driver can't yield the right of way in many crashes because he is traveling too fast. Even, if the light is green, or you are on a through street, be ready to give up the right of way if an emergency arises.
