Dr. Clime said that Eber-

 to the crash, which occurred  
 on the Marietta road at the  
 turn near Eberle cemetery.  
 The coroner said he learned  
 from Police Chief Michael  
 Good that Ebersole's car sud-

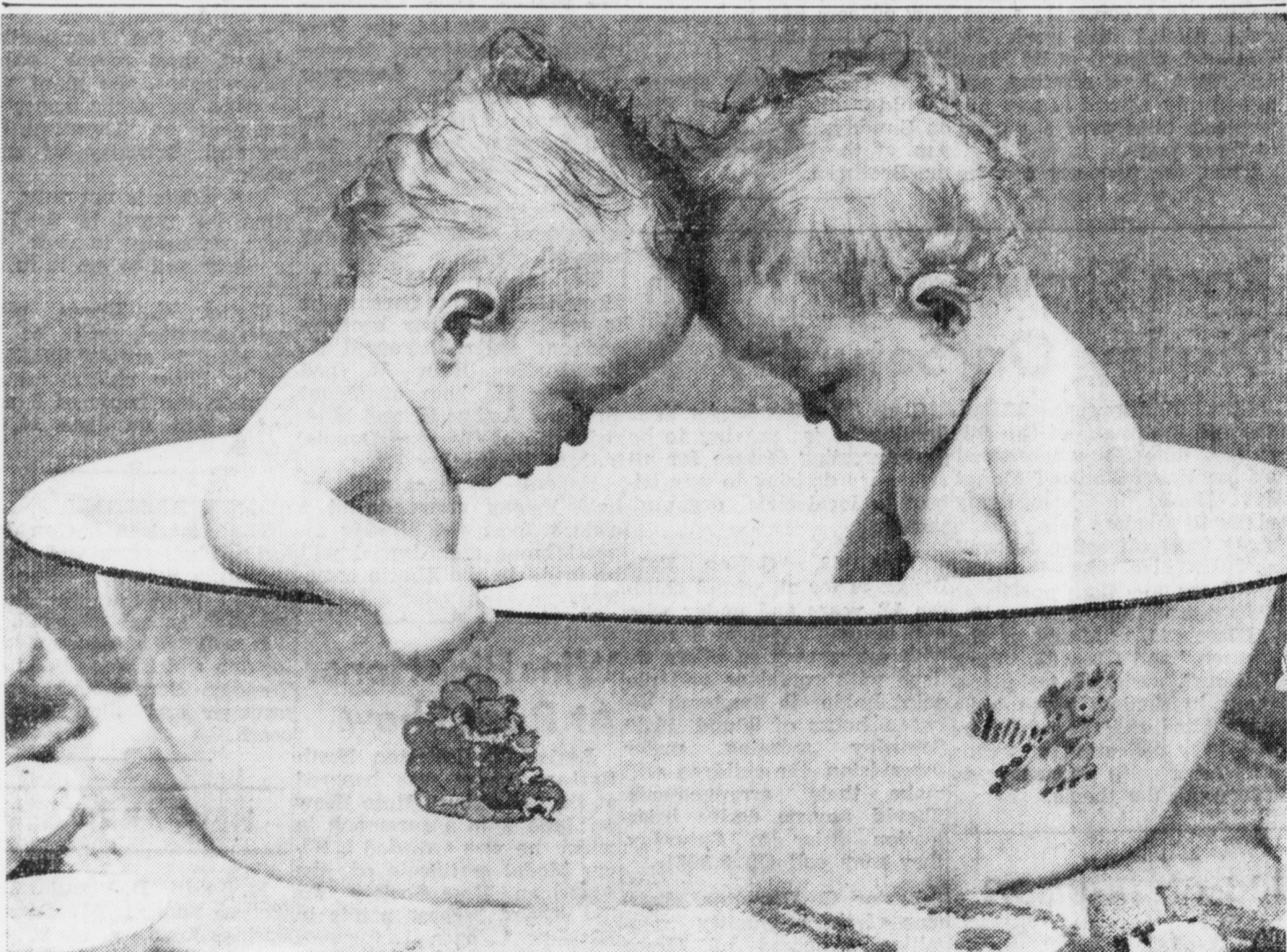
