Heat Pump Is More Popular

The electric heat pump is becoming an increasingly popular way to equip homes for year-around air conditioning. It provides central heating during the winter, then reverses at the flick of a switch to circulate cool, filtered, dehumidified air in the summer.

The method has the advantages of cleanliness, safety, uniform heating and cooling, and quiet, maintenance-free operation.

Two separate cabinets house the heat pump system, providing maximum installation flexibility. The cabinets may be attached and installed through a wall, or one section can be mounted outside the home and the other installed in a basement, utility room, crawl space, or attic.
