The class invited all 70 members who finished eighth grade with them, even though they may not have graduated.

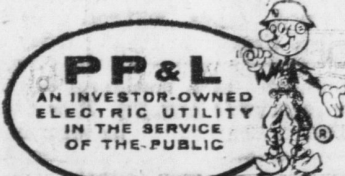
