The proposed bicycle ordinance, is obviously the product of a depraved mind, depraved in that this ordinance, apparently was originated by a prize knave, will infringe upon the few youthful, carefree years of the children of this borough. It is now only too evident to me that the Mount Joy "police" department has little else to do than ride around in its tax-paid car and apprehend small children for perpetrating the heinous crime of not possessing a bicycle license.

Organize New Tourism Plan

Formation of a new non-profit organization, to be known as Penn Tours, Inc., has been announced by Harold A. Swenson, Deputy Secretary of Commerce, as plans were pushed to bring foreign tourists into Pennsylvania.

Travel experts from all parts of the Commonwealth, and representatives of travel services, originally organized a committee to be known as Penn-U.S.A. Tours Committee. This same group will now form the nucleus of Penn Tours, Inc.

The purpose of the new organization is to determine ways and means of attracting European travellers to Pennsylvania, and to assist in the promotion of tours designed to accomplish the desired result.

Allegheny Airlines submitted a proposal to the new group to provide for unlimited travel over the Allegheny system at a special rate, with half fare for children under 21 years of age. The package deal will enable European tourists to stop off at any of the 38 cities in the Eastern United States served by Allegheny Airlines.

Another proposal that came before the group was a plan to provide "package tours" to Pennsylvania cities and resort centers, with authorized Travel Service organizations handling the promotion of such tours overseas.

The new organization requested the Pennsylvania Department of Commerce to engage in a study to determine costs of an overall promotional program for these tours.

JAMESTOWN SETTLERS Had They Missed The Boat

Fortunately for Americans it was a clear day. Otherwise we might all be speaking Spanish.

It was the spring of 1610, shortly after John Rolfe arrived in Jamestown.

The discouraged settlers were ready to give up, the result of a hard winter, known as the "starving time". The population had dwindled from 500 to about 60, from disease, malnutrition and Indian arrows.

Rolfe and the other new settlers brought hope, but few supplies. So the colonists loaded their ships and began the voyage back to England. Luckily, the weather was clear. While sailing down the James River, they spotted a fleet of ships from England carrying supplies and 150 new settlers. So they turned back to have another try.

By now the original dream of finding gold, and jewels had vanished. The colonists had tried producing glass, pitch and soap ashes. Sassafras and handsawed lumber had been shipped to England but there was little demand and little profit.

John Rolfe provided the answer. He had a hunch that Virginia's soil could produce

gold — golden leaf of tobacco.

Somehow he got some "Spanish-type" tobacco seeds from Trinidad. He cleared the land and planted his seeds.

After harvesting a small crop - a few hundred pounds at most - he shipped it to England. His tobacco was an immediate success.

New Standard Holds Clinic

On Monday, June 25, 1962, a clinic, held at the Mount Joy New Standard under the direction of Dr. H. James Elvin, Mount Joy, administered Mantoux Tuberculosis Tests.

The Mantoux is a skin test for determining the presence of T.B.

Four New Rules About Boating

Harrisburg — The Pennsylvania Fish Commission set April 1, 1963, as the date upon which four new boating regulations become effective.

The four regulations, in brief, are as follows:

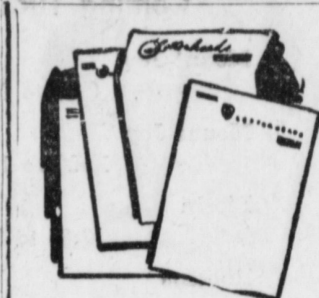
1. Persons under 14 who operate a motorboat between sunset and sunrise must either hold a boating safety certificate or be accompanied by a person 21 years of age or over.

2. No person shall place himself in any position or so conduct himself on a boat underway in such a manner as to endanger himself or any other person or property.

3. Operators of boats pulling water skiers, if under 14 years of age, must hold a boating safety certificate or be accompanied by at least one other person in the boat 14 years of age or older, unless the boat is equipped with a wide angle rear view mirror.

4. No motorboat shall be operated in careless disregard of the rights or safety of others or in a manner so as to endanger any person or property.
