The factory, which would be part of the Maytown Mfg. Company, is proposed to occupy a plot along the Mount Joy-Marietta pike on state Road 141, along the west side of the road a short distance south of the Donegal high school.

When we refer to this as an unprotected area, we would point out that the swimming pool has its life guard, who, besides rescuing a bather from drowning, rigidly enforces safety rules about the pool. Then we have the Safety Patrol in our schools and too we provide guards to see our children safely across the street.

Important as these things are, in none of these areas is a child exposed to danger to the same degree as a child riding a bicycle on the street.
