## Preschooler Needs High Quality Food

Provide quality to meet nutrition needs of preschoolers, advises Louise W. Hamilton, extension nutrition specialist of the Penna. State University.

If you get so concerned over the amount of food a child eats, you may neglect quality of the food. Quality foods are those packed with food value. Miss Hamilton explains, "They don't necessarily cost more; they just contain more food value per serving than other foods."

A preschooler grows less rapidly than he did as an infant. He is often less interested in eating and doesn't eat so much as he did. Although he may eat less, it's essential that he eat the right kinds of foods. A preschooler expends large amounts of energy each day. This means he needs fuel to keep going, and he may need more than three meals a day. Between meal snacks can keep up his energy and vitality, but snacks should be high-quality foods.

Illness may complicate the nutrition needs of preschoolers, Miss Hamilton says. It's usual for children in this age group to go through many bouts of sickness and childhood diseases. During these times, the child often has a poor appetite and eats less than usual. This means food intake is cut down when he needs more protective foods to recover from his illness.

All these conditions add up to extra care in feeding the preschooler. He must get all the nutrients he needs in the amount of food he eats. When you fear your child is not eating enough, what he eats is as important as how much. Don't feed him just anything to get him to eat, Miss Hamilton adds.
