Urge Booster Shots For Children

The Pennsylvania State Department of Health has urged parents to have their children protected by booster shots.

Director of the Bureau of Special Health Services in Harrisburg said many children have not received booster shots for polio, diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough and vaccination against smallpox since infancy.

A survey conducted last fall by the State Department of Health showed that in the 12 counties comprising Region VI, 21 per cent of children entering school in 1961 were not protected against diphtheria, whooping cough, and tetanus and only 39 per cent were completely protected.

Against polio, 19 per cent had no protection and only 38 per cent had complete protection. The study covered 32,631 children in 791 schools in Region VI (Berks, Carbon, Dauphin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Montour, Northampton, Northumberland, Schuylkill, Snyder and

A thorough checkup by the family doctor who knows the child's development, his reactions and what diseases he has had is recommended.

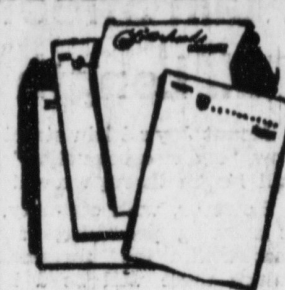
During the training, recruits receive tests and interviews which determine future training and assignments.
