

Home From Trip to West

Mr. and Mrs. Victor F. Hawthorne, Marietta R1, have returned from a four-week trip to the West Coast and the Redwoods section. They stopped in Indiana and Illinois to see friends, then via US 40 through St. Louis, Kansas City and Denver. In Colorado they spent some time at Colorado Springs, touring in the foothills of the Rockies and going up Pike's Peak, 14,110 feet high. From there they went on through Salt Lake City and the desert to spend twelve days with their son and his family in the Sierra Nevada mountains in California.

On their return trip, they went up along the Pacific coast, through the Redwoods section, into Oregon. Taking US 20 through Idaho, Montana and Wyoming, they spent one day in Yellowstone National park and visited friends in Iowa and Michigan. Take Lead In 'Go Roundup'

Each will be presented a Go Roundup banner for its unit flag. Boys who qualify will be awarded an embroidered pocket patch for their uniforms.

The Go Roundup campaign will continue through December 15.

Continue Progress On Main St.

A week of obvious, big progress!

That statement characterizes this week's report on the rebuilding of Mount Joy's Main street.

With weather favorable, workmen at mid-week had laid many square feet of concrete and there was an air of optimism among the sidewalk superintendents.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday the pavement spread westward from near Barbara street to New Haven and at the same time the workmen were readying forms for pouring of a third strip along the north side of Main street.

In the area between Barbara and Manheim, the pavement already is widened out to permit a controlled flow of traffic when the time comes. At that particular location, the extra width will require more strips to completely fill from curb to curb and to handle the cars and trucks which soon will be using that section.

Last week, paving was completely along the entire north half of the street between Longenecker road and Barbara street.

Now, as soon as that section is sufficiently cured, it will be ready for use by traffic. At that time, and it appears now that it will be soon, the big earth movers will begin ripping out the south half of the street.

In the meantime, work is progressing and is very near an end on the Marietta avenue bridge over the Pennsylvania railroad.

Earlier this week, it was anticipated that the bridge would be ready by Thursday noon.

Thus, within a very few days, traffic westbound will be able to enter the borough on the east, use the new concrete and take the detour out Marietta avenue without making the difficult "detour" around the detour which has existed over south Barbara, East Donegal, Columbia South Market, and Delta.
