PP&L Offers Eighteen Scholarships

Pennsylvania Power and Light Company will offer 18 scholarships under three separate programs to young men and women whose parents are PP&L customers, it was announced this week by Mr. Chas. E. Oakes, P P & L's board chairman and chief executive officer.

In announcing the scholarships, Oakes emphasized that today, more than ever, this nation is looking to college-trained young people for the thought, evaluation and creativity—in all fields of endeavor—which are vital ingredients in the building of a continually better civilization. Recognizing that cost of tuition is often a substantial deterrent to many qualified young people who seek a college education, PP&L offers these scholarships under its broad aid to education program.

Under program one, the utility's most extensive, 10 scholarships of \$600 a year will be given for study at any of 15 independent colleges in the company's service area. In this program, recognizing the problems of the independent colleges, the company parallels student aid with a \$500 grant to the institution each winner attends. Scholarship winners may pursue any course of study leading to a baccalaureate degree.

Under its second program, PP&L offers five undergraduate scholarships of \$200 annually for study at any of the four state colleges which it serves: Bloomsburg, East Stroudsburg, Lock Haven and Millersville. The principal objective of this program is to help the nation secure necessary new teachers, although the teaching field need not be the ultimate goal.

Under the Company's third program, three scholarships will be given for study at the College of Agriculture of The Pennsylvania State University. Each scholarship is in the amount of \$240 annually. This program is based on the belief that development of the full potential of America's agricultural resources calls for continued advancement of agricultural technology.

Competition under all three PP&L programs is open only to members of the current year's senior class. Eligibility for scholarships is also conditional upon scholastic achievement and graduation from an accredited high school or its equivalent, together with evidence of financial need.

Materials explaining the PP&L scholarship programs are available at any high school in the PP&L service area. An informative brochure outlining all of the programs in detail can be obtained either from high school principals, guidance counselors, agriculture teachers, county agents, or by calling or visiting the nearest PP&L office.

Since 1947, PP&L has been able to assist a total of 132 deserving young people in their search for a higher education in their chosen fields.
