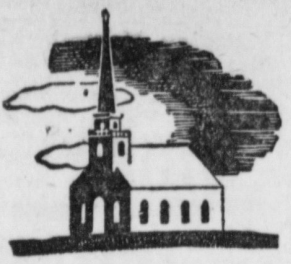

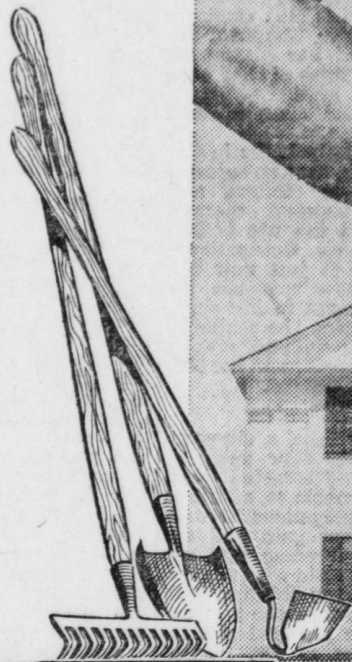

Produce Film At E'town

"Sons of the Jungle," a newly-released sound color film made by Elizabethtown people and produced with local personnel, will have its first showing Sunday evening, Dec. 2 at 7:30 p.m. at Mt. Calvary church in Elizabethtown.

"Sons of the Jungle" was filmed recently by the Rev. and Mrs. B. Lehman Keener of Elizabethtown who toured the South American fields of the Unevangelized Fields Mission, an organization doing pioneer work among the unreached tribes of Brazil.

The film features five tribes, portraying their primitive life and culture and the changes that have come with the Gospel after ten years of work with the Waiwai. Colorful Indian life and natural jungle beauty make it a very scenic film.

The film was produced in Elizabethtown with local personnel. The editing and the script were done by the Keeners; Art work, John Lehman, Bainbridge; narration, John Henry Brubaker, Mount Joy; organist, Dorothy Kuntzeiman, and the music and recording was done through the facilities of the Mt. Calvary Church with Edwin Ebersole as technician.

The Keeners are engaged in intensive missionary conference ministry across the States, having just completed itineraries to the mid-west and west coast, covering 13,000 miles in the last three months. They use visual methods in their presentation, and the Sunday evening service will include over head, back view projection and a dramatic portrayal of an Indian's great decision.

The public is invited to attend. The service will be under the direction of the pastor, the Rev. John Fleck.
