## Post Office Appreciates Cooperation In Mailing

Postmaster Elmer Zerpey has expressed his appreciation for the excellent cooperation so far on his 1962 "Mail Early for Christmas" campaign. He said, however, that only by stepping up all Christmas card and gift package mailings immediately, will it be possible to process and deliver cards and gifts by Christmas day.

The postmaster said further, "It looks like the Christmas mail this year will set an all-time record, far exceeding the 116,377 pieces of mail that were dispatched by the Mount Joy post office in the pre-holiday season of 1961." in addition to several thousand parcels.

He offered these good suggestions that are easy to follow - Be sure a return address and the recipient's name and address is plainly typed or written on all labels and Christmas cards. Always use zone numbers. Avoid abbreviations of state and city names.

Try to take parcels to the post office before 10 a.m. or between 1:30 and 3:30 p.m. to avoid the noon hour rush. Pack Christmas gifts in a strong corrugated carton. Use plenty of stuffing material to insure safe delivery. Seal packages with heavy paper adhesive tape and tie them with good, strong cord. Be sure to ask about Parcel Post size and weight limitations. Use the colorful new Christmas stamps on all Christmas cards. By sending

of-town delivery should be sent before Dec. 15, and those for local addresses should be mailed at least a week before Christmas.

## Chili Beans, Sun Valley Style



Chili Beans, Sun Valley Style, is a sturdy dish to be enjoyed at winter's ski parties and summer-time cook-outs, and may be served in a variety of ways. Made of plump perfect Idaho-grown pinto or colorful Red beans and tender juicy lean beef - lazy-simmered, tantalizingly seasoned with choice chili spices, a hint of ground cumin, bayleaf, garlic, onion, plus the flavor of Home - here is a famous recipe for year-round eating pleasure, family and guests alike.

**Chili Beans, Sun Valley Style**  
(about 10 servings, 1 1/2 cups each)

**Part 1**  
4 cups Idaho Pinto Beans  
12 cups (3 quarts) water  
4 teaspoons salt  
1 large peeled onion, whole  
1 large bayleaf  
1 fat clove garlic, thin-sliced  
2 tablespoons salad oil

To prepare Pinto or Red beans, combine in large heavy sauce pot or Dutch oven the washed beans and the measured amount of water, cold or hot. Bring water to boiling point and boil rapidly for 2 minutes. Remove from heat. Cover tightly. Let stand for one hour. Beans are now ready to cook. Note: beans may be soaked overnight, if desired. Add ingredients to beans and soaking water. Bring to boiling point rapidly, reduce heat to simmer. Cover pot tightly. Simmer about 2 hours or until not quite tender. Lift out and discard onion and bayleaf.

**Part 2**  
1 1/2 to 2 pounds lean ground beef  
2 tablespoons fat or finely-chopped suet  
1 cup water, beef stock, or tomato juice  
3 to 4 tablespoons good chili powder seasoning  
1/2 teaspoon ground cumin salt as needed

Brown meat quickly in the fat, breaking into small pieces. Add to beans. Add liquid to frying pan and heat to boiling point to bring up the browning bits and drippings. Add to beans. Measure into small dish 3 tablespoons of chili powder and the cumin. Mix to smooth paste using some of liquid from the bean pot. Add to bean mixture. Bring to boiling point, reduce heat to simmer. Cover tightly. Slow-cook for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, tasting in the meantime to find if more salt or chili powder is needed. Tastes and chili powder blends vary so much.

This makes 3 1/2 generous quarts which means 10 servings allowing about 1 1/2 cups per serving. Any leftover may be packaged and frozen. In fact, why not do another batch of the beans and plan to freeze one. They are so good for many occasions, help to pad the meat course, and all ages enjoy them.
