While men were fighting the fire on the second floor, men worked speedily on the first floor to protect furniture and clothing by carefully stacking them in the center of the room and covering them with tarpaulins.

Friends and neighbors arrived almost simultaneously with the firemen to offer all forms of assistance. We appreciate each and everyone of them far more than we can adequately express. My father always spoke of the big heart of Mount Joy but we never realized it was as big and magnificent as we saw it displayed on Monday evening.
