**Map New School Bus Schedule**

The Donegal Union School Board has decided to improve the transportation system for pupils in the district. Part of this program is readied for this year. With the completion of the addition to the Grandview Element-

ary School next year, further improvements will be possible.

Four additional buses have been added to the Donegal bus system for the 1963-64 school year. With the additional buses, a number of changes have been made in the routes, are designed to improve not only the transportation program; but the total educational program as well.

The travel time from home to school and home again has been shortened considerably, which will enable schools to enrich and lengthen the program of studies in the schools.

If any emergency situations arise, and during bad weather it will be possible with a minimum amount of adjustment to dismiss any school independently of the others.

Any changes existing in the routes and schedules, will be announced to both students and bus drivers as soon as possible. The success

of the transportation program depends largely upon the cooperation of pupils and parents as well as bus drivers and school authorities.

Complete bus schedules will be published next week and also made available to all residents of the district.
