An urgent message is being issued this week to residents of Florin who are now part of the new door-to-door mail delivery system.

It is important — VERY IMPORTANT—that mail be addressed correctly. Use of only the name of the person who is to receive the mail is not sufficient. And-the fact that "everyone knows where I live" does not solve the problems of door-to-door carrier service.

Mail should be addressed completely and properly. And-residents of Florin should notify those persons and businesses who habitually send them mail that the full address should be includ-

A proper address for Florin ward mail would look something like this:

Mr. John Doe 123 Pleasant Street Florin Station Mount Joy, Penna. 17552

It is a requirement of the U.S. Postal Service Department that house numbers and street addresses be used.
