**Murphy Lists
1963 Earnings**
G. C. Murphy Company net earnings for the second half of 1963 exceeded those for the same 1962 period to produce earnings per share of \$1.41 for the year 1963, compared with \$1.51 in 1962, according to J. S. Mack, chairman of the Board and President.
Sales in the second half of the year decreased only .03 percent compared with 3.5% in the first 6 months, when most of the loss occurred bringing 1963 sales to \$267,836,618 or 1.7% below the record volume attained in 1962. January 1964 sales set an all-time record for the month.
