ENLISTS IN ARMY

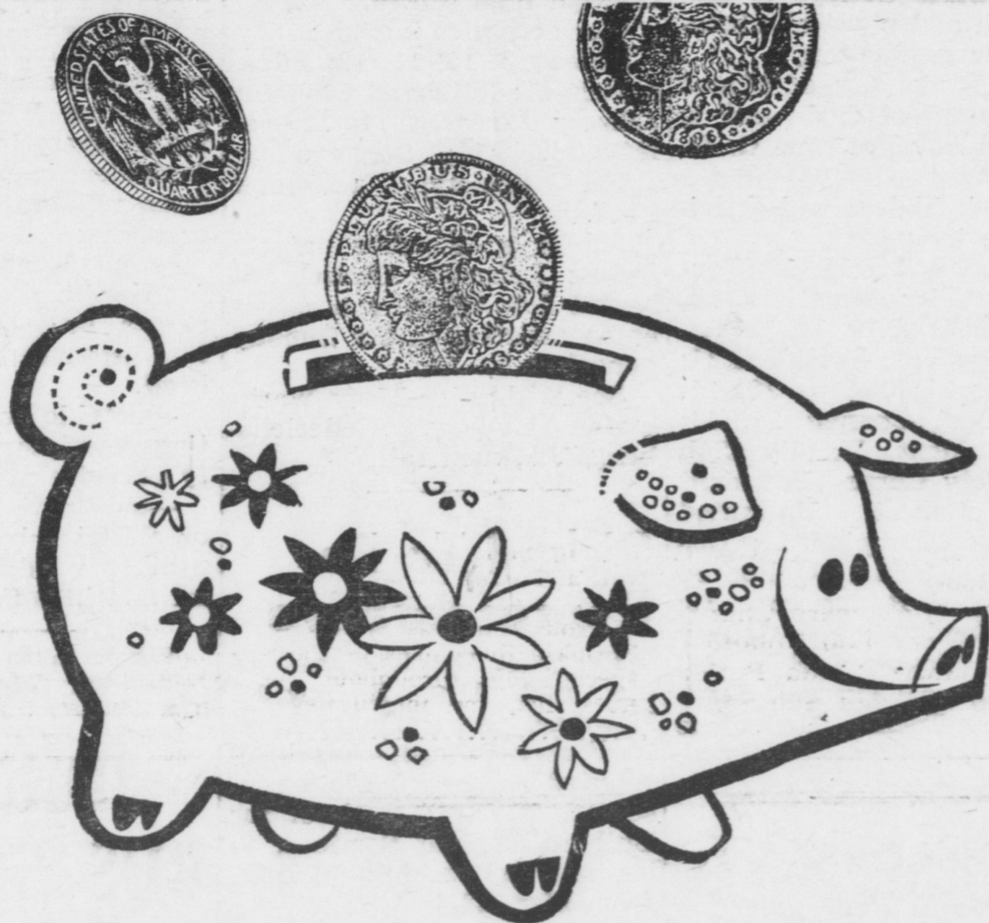

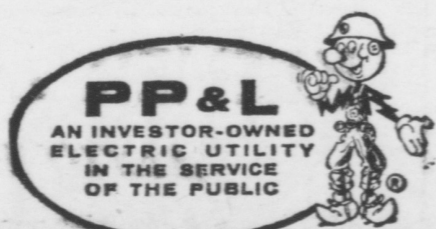

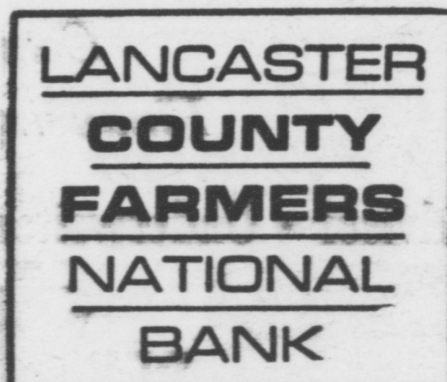
