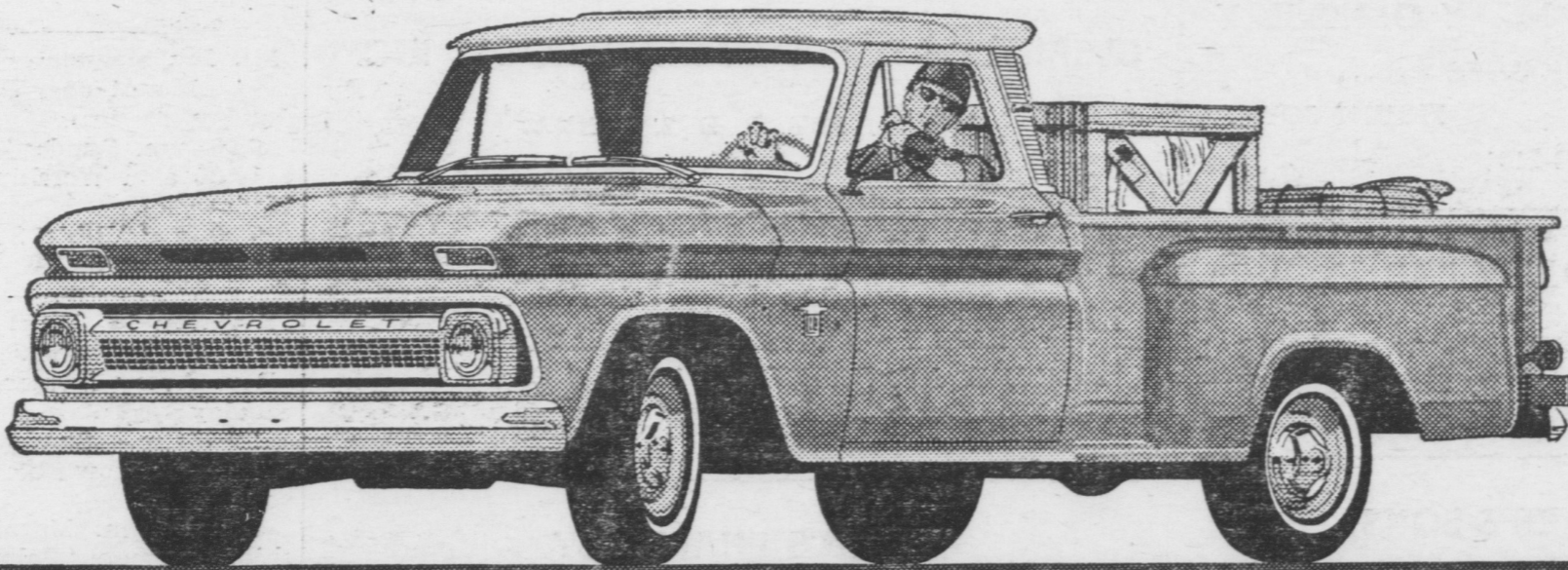
All scouts 7 through 17 from the Donegal Neighborhood are eligible to attend.
