Dissolve gelatin and salt in boiling water. Drain orange cheese until almost smooth. and grapefruit sections, reserving syrup. Add enough orange-grapefruit syrup to gingerale to make 134 cups of liquid. Add lemon juice. Stir into gelatin until blended. Chill until thickened to consistency of egg white. Meanwhile, cook macaroni in boiling salted water until tender, yet firm, 6 to 8 minutes. Drain and rinse with cold water. Blend cottage cheese and orange rind into thickened gelatin. 
