Some Special Party Salads

If you're looking for something special to serve at a "special" luncheon, here are some ideas for you. Salads are always good "features" at a luncheon, either when you are serving your guests buffet style or serving them at a luncheon table.

CRAB MACARONI SALAD
8 ounces medium shell macaroni
1 cup small curd cream-style cottage cheese (8 oz.)
¼ cup chili sauce
2 tablespoons lemon juice
2 tablespoons creamy French dressing
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
½ teaspoon salt
½ cup finely chopped green pepper
½ cup finely chopped green onion, tops included
¾ cup cooked crabmeat (7½ oz. can or 6-oz. package, frozen)

Cook macaroni in boiling, salted water until tender, yet firm, about 15 minutes. Rinse with cold water and drain. Meanwhile, beat cottage cheese until almost smooth.

Blend in chili sauce, lemon juice, French dressing, Worcestershire sauce and salt. Stir pepper and onion into macaroni. Add cottage cheese mixture and stir lightly. Fold in crabmeat. Cover and refrigerate at least one hour. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

ALPHABET FRUIT SALAD

1 3-ounce package orange-flavored gelatin
1 3-oz. package lemon-flavored gelatin
¼ teaspoon salt
2 cups boiling water
2 cups canned orange and grapefruit sections with syrup (1-lb. can)
1 7-oz. bottle ginger ale
1 tablespoon lemon juice
8 ounces alphabet macaroni
1 cup small curd creamed cottage cheese, drained (8 ounces)
1 tablespoon grated orange rind
1 cup chopped, pitted, cooked prunes

Dissolve gelatin and salt in boiling water. Drain orange and grapefruit sections, reserving syrup. Add enough orange-grapefruit syrup to gingerale to make 1¾ cups of liquid. Add lemon juice. Stir into gelatin until blended. Chill until thickened to consistency of egg white. Meanwhile, cook macaroni in boiling salted water until tender, yet firm, 6 to 8 minutes. Drain and rinse with cold water. Blend cottage cheese and orange rind into thickened gelatin. Stir in orange and grapefruit sections, macaroni and prunes. Place 9-in. square pan on tray in refrigerator. Pour gelatin into pan. Chill until firm. Cut into squares to serve. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

GLAZED PEACH TARTS

Pastry for 1 crust pie
6 cling peach halves and syrup (1-lb. 13 oz. can)
1 tablespoon cornstarch
½ teaspoon cinnamon
Streusel Topping
Prepare pastry through step of flattening dough with rolling pin. Divide dough into 6 equal portions. Roll out each portion to circle ½ inch thick. Fit into 4-inch tart pans. Trim and flute edges.

Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture begins to boil and thicken. Boil for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour two (Turn to page 11)

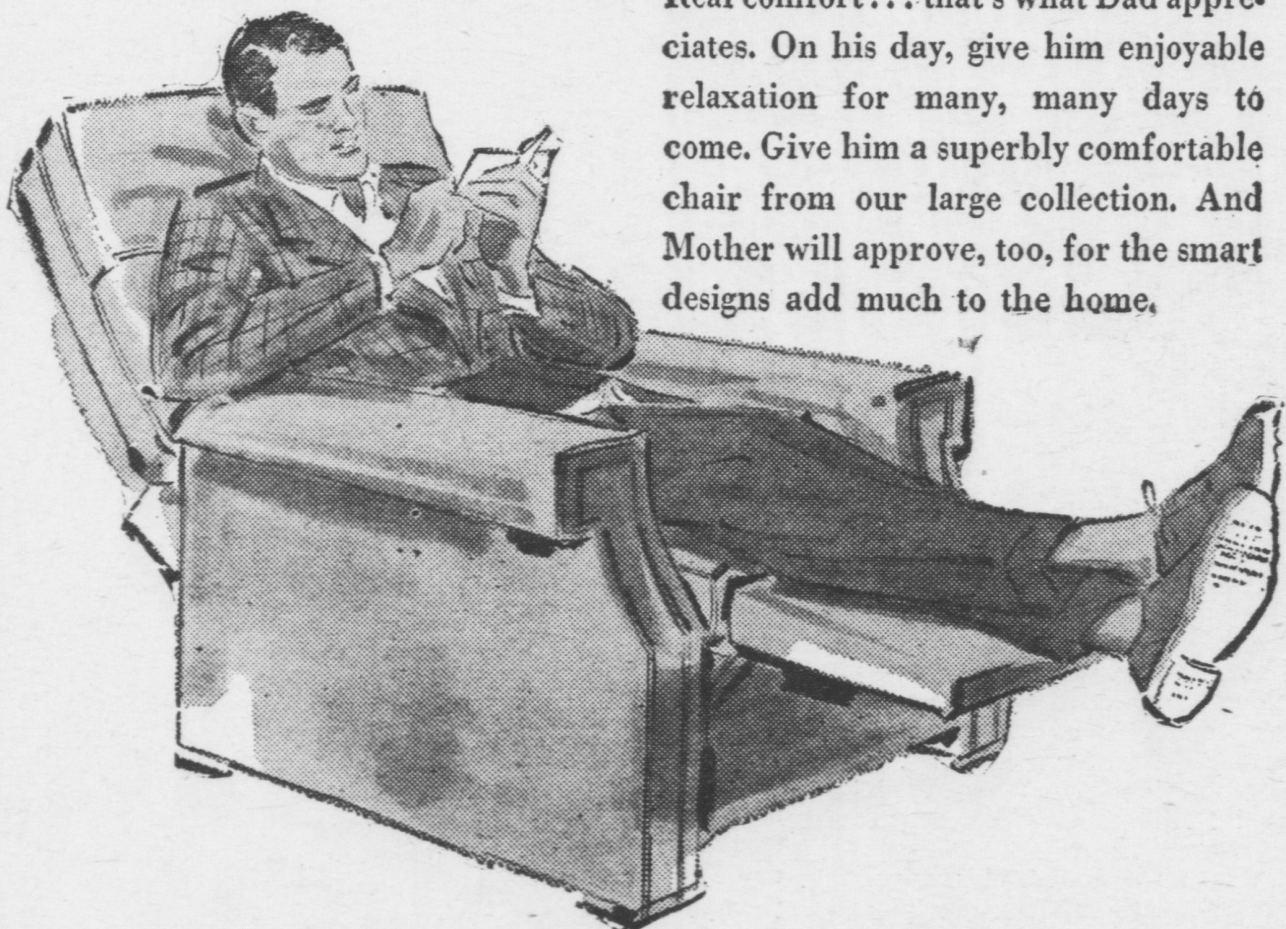
