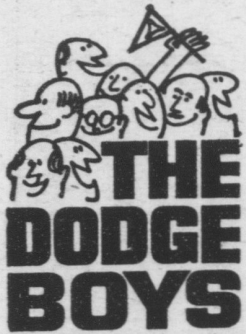

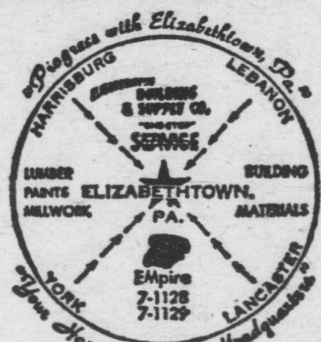

CHOCOLATE STAINS

When a chocolate stain is in a washable fabric, sponge or soak the spot in cool water, then wash with a synthetic detergent, advises Mrs. Mae Barton, Penn State extension clothing specialist. If a brown stain remains after washing and rinsing, use a mild bleach, but first test the bleach on the hem or other inconspicuous place for colorfastness. If a greasy stain remains, use carbon tetrachloride or other grease solvent.
