## BACK YARD BARBECUING—53 STORIES UP!



Sally and Sirio Tonelli enjoy the Chicago skyline from the balcony of their 53rd floor Marina City apartment while preparing barbecued chicken, baked potatoes and garlic bread on a covered charcoal brazier. The Tonellis have discovered that "back yard bar-

becuing" need not be limited just to families with back yards and patios. The kettle-shaped, covered barbecue acts as an oven and adjustable dampers enable our balcony chef to accurately control cooking temperatures. Covered barbecues are ideal for balcony cookouts because they are not affected by wind and are virtually smokeless. Manufactured by Weber-Stephen Products Co., Wood Dale, Illinois, the baked porcelain kettle is completely weatherproof (the legs are aluminum) and can be left outdoors the year 'round.

Weber offers this important tip for better barbecuing. For

cuts of meat, such as steaks, place the meat on a grill directly over a layer of hot charcoal briquettes. For whole meats, such as roasts or the chicken Mr. Tonelli is preparing, arrange the briquettes on either side of the kettle, with a foil drip pan in the middle. Place the meat on a grill directly over the drip pan. With the kettle lid in place, indirect heat will bake the food and juices will be cooked in, not out, for more flavor. What juices do escape will fall into the drip pan, not on the hot briquettes, thus eliminating flare-ups and most of the smoke.
