

TIGHTER FIT

If a hole in the wall becomes too large to hold the screw, take the screw out, pack the hole with steel wool

and put the screw back in. Or, poke a wooden match in the hole, break it off at the wall surface, and then replace the screw.

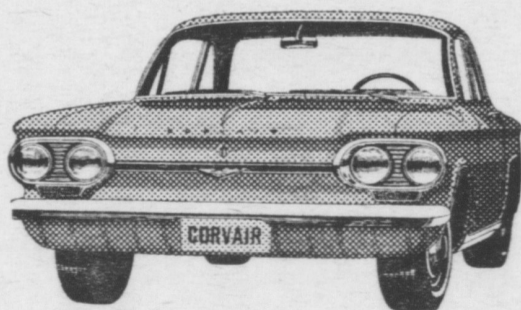
Chevrolet Impala Sport Coupe



Chevelle Malibu Sport Coupe



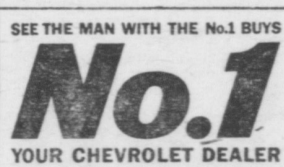
Chevy II Nova 2-Door Sedan
