know the answers. But not because he would be uninformed. Unless he can remember from his own knowledge, he has no way of knowing any better than any private citizen. He has no copies of the ordinances. You could ask the mayor, the President of borough council, an attorney, or an old-timer on the street corner. They would all have the same answer. They don't know.

None of them know the answer unless they can personally recall the facts, and then it is just their word for it. If you get in trouble on their word, you're still in trouble.

Absolutely the only way anyone can know the truth and the whole truth about the laws of Mount Joy is to arrange a time with the Borough Secretary—who is cooperative but a part-time employee—and then to comb the old minute and ordinance books of Mount Joy until you find the answer or don't find it.

It would be no disgrace for the best informed local citizen to flunk an examination on the Mount Joy borough ordinances—the laws which govern his every day living.

But, his ignorance could get him into trouble with the law.

Mount Joy's laws should be codified, published and copies made available to the public. Several should be placed in the new library. Anyone who has any reasonable need for a copy should have one and extra copies should be available to any citizen at any time for whatever purpose he has in mind.
