IT PAYS

To Be Educated

If a boy is thinking about leaving high school before he is graduated in order to make some money, he ought to think again. Our old friend "Finance Facts" tells us that the high-school graduate is going to make \$38,000 more in a lifetime's work than the fellow who doesn't quite get through, and \$121,000 more than the boy who only made it through grade school. Withdrawal from high school occurs chiefly at ages 16 and 17, when school is no longer compulsory and may seem unattractive. But unemployment isn't so attractive either, and it is three times higher among those who have left school prematurely than among those who stay on to graduation.

Not everybody is in love with regular academic education. Schools are beginning to think more carefully than ever about ways to interest non-verbal young people and to teach them skills they will be able to market later, especially in technical fields with a future. While educators are the chief ones with a vested interest in the drop-out problem, all of us have to club together to support the unemployed. So all of us ought to club together to make staying in school until graduation the fashionable thing to do. —Selected

1. With snap beans or summer squash, cook a table-spoon or two of minced onion green pepper, or parsley.
2. Cook a few mint leaves with peas.
3. Put a small pinch or herb or spice in the water when you cook lima beans.
4. A little vinegar and sugar heated together make a dressing for snap beans or cabbage, with or without a few tablespoons of cream.

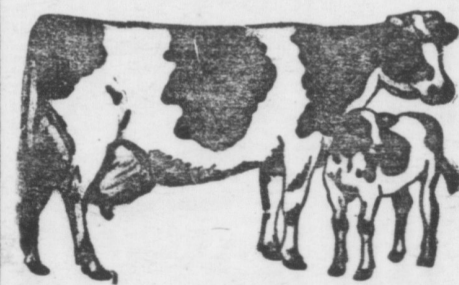
