## Drive Carefully In Game Lands

With the hunting season here, Keystone Automobile Club warns motorists to be particularly cautious when driving through regions where animal wildlife abound.

Animals can quickly complicate things for the motorist at any time, said Edward P. Curran, the Club's Safety Director. Startled deer charging onto the highway sometimes are the cause of serious accidents, and birds flying into windshields constitute a real danger. Sudden stops or swerves by inattentive drivers to avoid hitting animals are also a hazard, he said.

Pointing out that at night a steady headlight beam will frequently hypnotize animals into immobility, he suggested that the blinking of lights generally will break the spell and frighten animals from the roadway.

With hunters tramping the fields, birds may be driven to the fences and hedgerows along the highways; they become startled when cars are near and may fly directly into the path of vehicles. A honk of the horn when birds are seen ahead ordinarily is enough to make them dash for cover.

The Keystone official urged all motorists to do their part in the prevention of accidents by heeding such warnings.

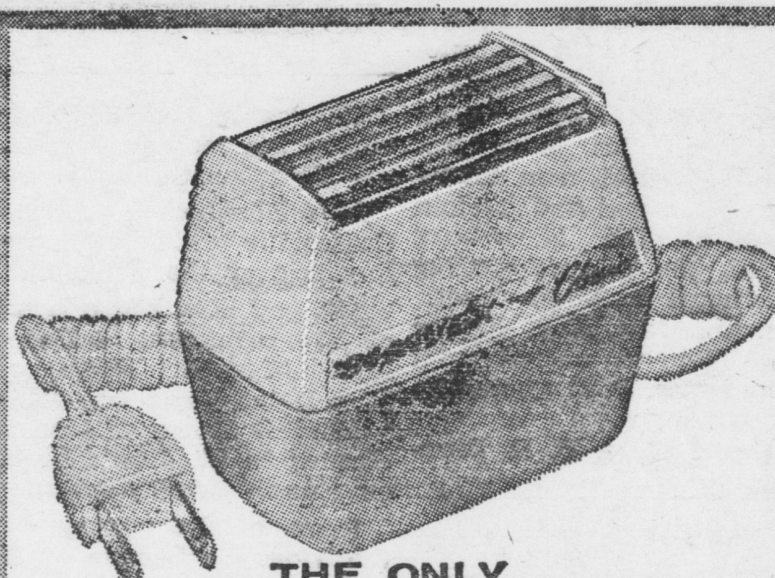
