



Drive Carefully In Game Lands With the hunting season here, Keystone Automobile Club warns motorists to be par icularly cautious when through driving reg.ons where animal wildlife a-

bound. Animals can quickly complicate things for the motorist at any time, said Edward P. Curran, the Club's Safety Direc or. Startled deer charging onto the highway sometimes are the cause of serious accidents, and birds flying into windshields constitute a real danger. Sudden stops or swerves by ina tentive drivers to avoid hitting animals are also a hazard, he said.

Pointing out that at night a steady headlight beam will frequently hypnot ze animals into immobility, he suggested that the blinking of lights generally w.ll break the spell and frighten animals
