#### ELECTRIC CORD CARE TIP

If a cord is permanently attached to an electric appliance, wrap it loosely around the appliance, advises Mrs. Cecile Sinden, Penn State home management specialist. Be sure an iron or other heating appliance is cool before wrapping because the heat will burn away the insulated covering. On a vacuum cleaner, wrap the cord around the hooks, using no tension as you wrap.

#### SAVE BABY PIGS

Keep newborn pigs from chilling during cold weather, says Les Burdette, extension livestock specialist at Penn. State University. Cold, drafty, wet farrowing pens cause troubles with baby pigs. The high death rate among baby pigs can often be prevented by good management.
