Tuna And Rice Are Nice



Tuna and rice are very nice, especially when they're combined pilaf style. Tuna pilaf is a quick, attractive family meal high in nourishment and good taste. Tuna's protein is comparable to that found in lean meat, and its delicate flavor is liked by all the family. This is a thrifty meal, too. Tuna's reasonable price is a boon to the Lenten budget. Flavorful vegetables, sauteed in the tasty vegetable oil the tuna is packed in, add an appetizing touch to the pilaf.

Tuna Pilaf

- 2 cans (6½ or 7 ounces each) tuna in vegetable oil
- 1 cup diced celery
- ½ cup chopped onion
- 1 large green pepper, diced
- 3 cups cooked rice
- ½ cup diced pimiento
- 1 can (3 or 4 ounces) sliced mushrooms
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon Accent
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 1 teaspoon each, rosemary and marjoram

Drain oil from tuna into skillet; heat. Add celery, onion and green pepper; cook until vegetables are crisp tender (about 3 minutes). Add tuna, rice, pimiento, mushrooms with liquid and seasonings. Heat to serving temperature.
YIELD: 4 to 6 servings.
