1 can (3 or 4 ounces) sliced mushrooms 1 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon Ac'cent 1/4 teaspoon pepper

1 teaspoon each, rosemary

and marjoram Drain oil from tuna into skillet; heat. Add celery, onion and green pepper; cook until vegetables are crisp tender (about 3 minutes). Add tuna, rice, pimiento, mushrooms with liquid and seasonings. Heat to serving temperature. YIELD: 4 to 6 servings.
