TO EAST STROUDSBURG

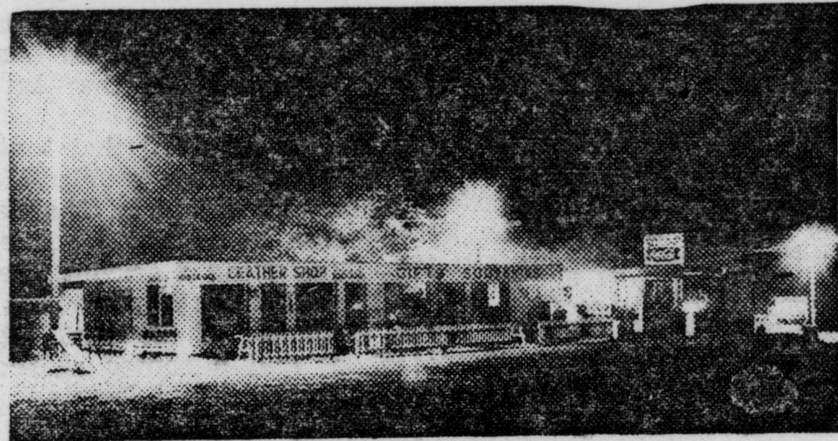

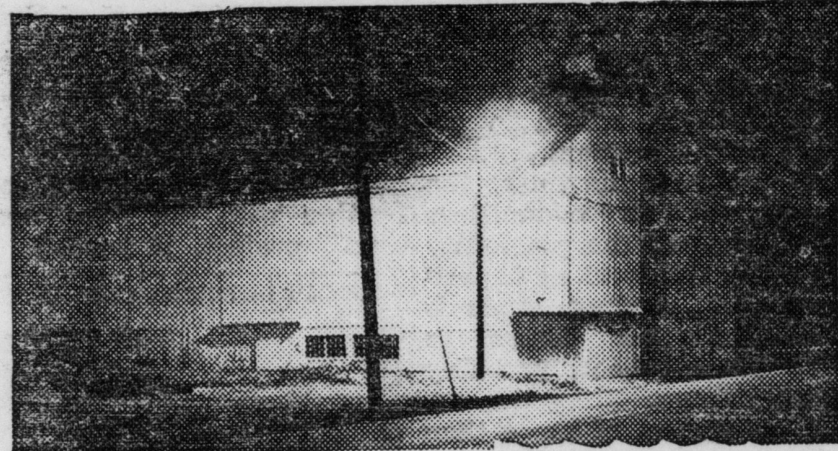
