Ag Survey

Farmers in the Mount Joy area are being asked to supply pertinent information about livestock in a survey starting May 20. Postmaster Elmer Zerphey has announced.

Cards will be delivered to farm mail boxes, selected at random on rural routes served by the Mount Joy post office.

These semi-annual surveys are conducted cooperatively each year by the post office and agriculture departments and serve as a basis for estimating numbers of livestock on farms; livestock production; the size of the pig, calf, lamb and wool corps; and the number of chickens raised. This information is of considerable importance to farmers, the livestock industry, industries serving agriculture, public agencies and the general public.

Farmers receiving survey cards have been urged to fill them out and to return them promptly to their mail carriers. Postmaster Zerphey said.


